School-Wide Plan Summary 2021-2022

The School-Wide Plan of Washington Elementary consists of many areas which help our students to progress and be successful in their studies and will set the foundation for success in life. We have strived to build a school climate which is centered on student achievement and an attitude of being successful and progressing toward individual goals. Each grade level has Essential Standards and Learning Targets that they focus on to ensure that our students are successful academically. We have also implemented the Eagles' Nest to support our students' social and emotional health.

Interventions are part of our daily schedule to ensure that students have the opportunity to master the concepts that are essential for success in school. By using our literacy and math programs, best instructional practices, in-school interventions, and our social-emotional curriculum in addition to our wellness room (The Eagles' Nest), we are giving each child the opportunity to learn and progress on an individual basis. Our highly qualified teachers and support staff have extensive training and knowledge and are able to teach effectively and in a way that each child will have the best opportunities to learn and feel success.

Our staff is trained in Schoology, technology, Reach for Reading, My Math, grade level collaboration, Professional Learning Communities, conferences, and the EYE program for new teachers.

Our parents are involved through Student/Educator/Parent conferences (SEP's), School Community Council, PTA, Book Fair, parent workshops, and many volunteer hours. We notify our parents of upcoming events through bi-monthly newsletters, our school website, our school Facebook account, Power School phone calls and emails, the student handbook, and our marquee message board.

We offer many academic intervention activities for our students which include: iReady, Imagine Learning, ESL interventions, specific and targeted small group interventions, full day kindergarten for all kindergarten students, and a Title I preschool program for our four year old students.

We are participating in the Tans Treats Backpack Program through the Tans Treats Foundation which provides food for students to take home on weekends. We are also utilizing our local food bank (Utah Food Bank), which comes to our school once a month to distribute food to our families.

Our school has set a goal to strengthen tier 1 engagement strategies, utilize Essential Standards (post them/refer to them), "WIN" time 4 days a week, collect and use data to drive instruction, Utah Teaching Standards (particularly Standard 7), purposeful planning, and implement proven best practices. We will meet twice a month as a faculty to continue our professional learning with a focus on classroom management and positive social interaction. As a Title I school, we will coordinate with Federal, State, and Local services and programs. This School-Wide Plan will be completed yearly to assess the growth and needs at Washington Elementary.
